FRANKLINTON BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS CONTINUE WORK ON 2012 - 13 BUDGET

As you know, spring is the time of year when we clean, and plan. It's no different for the Franklinton Board of Commissioners, as the Board works to create the budget for the 2012-13 fiscal year. The Board began meeting in workshops around the budget in early April. (Remember – workshops are open to the pub-

lic!) With input from the Budget Advisory Committee, as well as Town staff and citizens, the Board will continue its work throughout the month of May. A budget workshop has been scheduled for May 9. The final proposed budget will be presented to the Board of Commissioners and the public at the regular Board of Commissioners meeting on Tuesday, May 15.

All Town residents will have an opportunity to have their voice heard on the 2012-13 budget!

There will be four opportunities:

Tuesday, May 15 - Town Hall Annex (Board of Commissioners Meeting)

Wednesday, May 23 – American Legion Post 52

Tuesday, June 12 – Franklinton Lions Club

Tuesday, June 19 - Town Hall Annex (Board of Commissioners Meeting)

The proposed budget will be posted on the Town's website (www.franklintonnc.us) and will be available for review at Town Hall during regular business hours. Please take an opportunity to review the Town's budget to understand how your property tax dollars and utility fees will be spent! Feel free to ask questions of your Board of Commissioners, as well as Town Manager Tammy Ray, by contacting them using the contact information found on the back cover of this and every edition of Community Notes.

OneFranklinton Continues Façade Grant Program

One of the major focus areas of *OneFranklinton* is the appearance of the streetscape along Main Street and in the downtown/uptown area. After several years of fundraising and the hard work of a subcommittee in developing guide-lines and an application, *OneFranklinton* Facade Grant Pro-

gram has been rolled out for just over a year! Those who own properties in the historic downtown business district are eligible to apply for a 50% matching grant (up to a \$2,000 reimbursement) to replace, upgrade, or repair the exterior façade of their property. The grants will be awarded quarterly, with applications due mid-quarter on a rolling deadline basis. Remaining deadlines for 2012 are May 31, August 31, and November 30. Awards will be announced at the regular meetings of the Franklinton Board of Commissioners in July, October, and January following the application deadlines, and winners will be notified by mail prior to the public announcements. You Can Recycle Your CFL Bulbs Right Here!

CFLs and tube fluorescent lights (like those found in Town Hall and the Town Hall Annex) contain mercury, which is a dangerous element that can poison humans and animals with even the slightest of contact. Proper disposal of such semi-hazardous material is key to ensuring a safe living and working environment. Currently, there are programs in our region for recycling mercury bulbs, including Home Depot's CFL recycling program, and Wake County's bulb site in Knightdale. However, there really is nothing of convenience to the citizens of Franklin County, much less Franklinton, which is what

prompted the Town to create, for

Town residents, a mercury bulb recycling program. This program does not require residents to pay an extra fee or a recycling fee, as many recycling programs do, and is easy to use.

Emergency Planning: Preparing for Spring Storms

Storm Safety Procedures

The following steps should help keep you and your family safe from harm in the event of a spring storm.

- Create an emergency action plan that includes evacuation procedures and contact information for local first responders.
- Keep supplies in an emergency preparedness kit. Suggested items include water bottles, non-perishable food, blankets, first-aid supplies, flashlights, and a batterypowered radio.
- Contact your state emergency management office for information about local shelters, evacuation plans, and emergency exit routes.
- Choose a safe area in your home where occupants can gather if a storm or tornado warning is issued. This area should be located in a basement if available, or a groundlevel room with no windows.

After the Storm

While your electric power is very reliable, outages do happen. Damage can also result in long-term downtime. By planning ahead, you can get back to business quickly and minimize the damage to your bottom line.

Backup Power—Dependable back-up power is necessary to maintain mission-critical equipment during an outage. Diesel and natural gas generators are the most commonly used. Diesel



systems are the most widely used and typically have the lowest initial costs.

HAVE YOUR UTILITY BILL DRAFTED!



Most every resident in Town has a utility bill. For decades, the Town's policy has been that Town utility bills

are due on the 9th of the month, are late after 5:30pm on the 9th of the month, and if not paid by 5:30pm on the 14th of the month, the customer's utilities are cut off. Those policies will continue in the 2012-13 budget year. Want an easy way to not have to remember to get your payment to Town Hall **and** save a little money on postage or gas? Use our bank draft service!

To set up automatic bank draft, bring a voided check to Town Hall, and fill out a brief form. The entire process will take less than ten minutes! It also makes paying your utility bill **much** simpler, because it will automatically be drafted from your checking account on the 5th of the month. So avoid the big lines! Set up automatic bank draft today!
