## National Night Out is August 4!

The Franklinton Police Department will participate in its 18th annual observance of National Night Out on August 4, 2009. This year's event will be held downtown on Main Street. Main Street from Vine Street to Green Street will be closed for the event, and the Franklinton Police Department will be cooking just for you, our citizens!

Franklinton is one of the 10,000+ communities that were involved in observing National Night Out in 2008. NNO is sponsored by the National Association of Town Watches and is an effort to heighten crime prevention awareness; generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime programs; strengthen neighborhood spirit and police community partnerships; and send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

NNO began in Franklinton in 1992 with residents being encouraged to turn on their porch lights and come outside, while officers made visits to as many residents as possible. Participation was so overwhelming that "Block Parties" had to be organized to so that officers could meet more citizens. In 2006, the Town boasted eight "Block Parties" which, to say the least, afforded officers, elected officials, and staff little time for meaningful interaction at each host site, so in 2007 we organized one big event which was held at the Franklinton Park. This brought all of our citizens together at one location and allowed all of our police, fire, rescue and town officials an opportunity to meet and get to know our citizens. A second successful Franklinton Park event was held in 2008.

For the past several years, proceeds from the sale of raffle tickets go to host the annual senior citizen picnic held on Halloween each year. If you are interested in volunteering or making a donation for this event please contact Town Hall at 919-494-2520.

## Summer Safety Tips

Summer is the time for outdoor fun and relaxation. Common summertime activities like swimming, biking, skating, gardening, picnicking, or just sitting in the sun can create safety hazards if not approached with care. The following tips are some simply ways you can stay safe and avoid the

risk created by your fun in the sun time.

- Preventing Heat-Related Illness
- \* Dress for the heat
- \* Drink plenty of water
- Take regular breaks
- Eat small meals and eat more often (avoid foods high in protein which increases metabolic heat)

#### Bug Safety

- Avoid scented hair & skin care product when planning to be outdoors
- Use insect repellent (products containing DEET are most effective against ticks & mosquitoes)
- Avoid areas where insects nest or congregate (stagnant water, blooming flowers, uncovered foods)
- If you experience flu like symptoms (head ache, fever, body aches) after finding a tick on your body contact your physician for professional care

#### General Outdoor Safety

- Wear broad spectrum sunscreen with a SPF 15 or greater (apply 20 minutes before extended outdoor exposure & every 2 hours while outside)
- Be aware that the sun is most concentrated between 10 am and 4 pm so plan activities accordingly
- \* Follow the manufacture safety & maintenance guidelines for grills and outdoor equipment

On Saturday, September 26, the URC will be hosting its first Franklinton Communitywide Yard Sale – the Ultimate Recycling! If you have a few things – or a garage full of stuff – that you've been wanting to clean out or get rid of, but haven't had the time or the place to put it out to see if anybody wanted any of it – now's your chance! You'll be able to rent a table for \$10, and you can rent as many tables as you'd like. Pre-registration is preferred, as we cannot guarantee a table on the day of the event. (If we run out of tables, you can bring your own and rent a space for \$5.) The event will be advertised across the community and the county, so join us in promoting reuse of products already made!

The URC will also host a concession stand that day, selling hot dogs, nachos, chips, drinks, and candy. The sale will open at 8:00am (you can come set up at 7:00am), and will be open until 5:00pm. Any items leftover at the end of the day may be donated to Franklin County Volunteers in Medicine, a nonprofit organization providing healthcare to the uninsured, which has recently opened a thrift store in downtown Franklinton. FCVIM volunteers will be on hand with boxes ready to take leftover items!

And don't forget...immediately following the conclusion of the Communitywide Yard Sale, live entertainment begins at 6:00pm, followed by Movies on Main!



# New Alerting System

The Franklinton Police Department now has the ability to provide our citizens with up to date emergency information via email or text message. Nixle is a company offering the Franklinton Police Department free access to an emailing and texting system to alert the citizens of Franklinton and the surrounding area of important information. This system has given our agency the ability to send trusted, timesensitive and geographically-targeted information using their existing secure network terminals.

Citizens can sign up to receive free email or text message alerts from the police department regarding crime alerts, missing persons or runaways. This service will also allow our agency to attach pictures of persons "wanted" by the police department. It is our goal to increase the police department's effectiveness by allowing us to get out important emergency information as soon as possible to the citizens of Franklinton.
